AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN SANTA FE COUNTY AND THE SANTA FE PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT

THIS AMENDMENT is made and entered into between Santa Fe County (County) the Santa Fe Public Schools (SPFS).

WHEREAS, on May 5, 2016, the County and SFPS entered into Memorandum of Agreement No. 2016-0274-CSD/MM ("MOA") to provide for their agreement to jointly fund a part-time coordinator for the Santa Fe Opiate Safe multidisciplinary work group (SOS); and

WHEREAS, the MOA is due to expire November 30, 2016 and the County and SFPS wish to continue to support the efforts of the SOS and the Alliance by extending the term of the MOA, increasing the scope of work of the SOS Coordinator with respect to Narcan related activities, and providing for additional compensation payable to the SOS Coordinator; and

WHEREAS, according to Paragraph 10 (Amendment) of the MOA, the MOA may be amended by an instrument in writing signed by the parties; and

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Pargraph 1.A. (Scope of Duties of the parties), is amended by inserting the following as subparts 10 through 15:
 - 10. Identify gaps in training and barriers to Narcan accessibility and plan and implement a strategy to increase Narcan use.
 - 11. Provide outreach, education and training to First Responders, providers, the Santa Fe County Corrections Department and community groups regarding the dangers of opiates and the benefits of evidenced-based harm reduction strategies and over-dose prevention.
 - 12. Increase the distribution and use of Narcan County-wide by providing entities with Narcan kits and supplies on as as-needed basis, training and technical support on the development of internal policies on Narcan use.
 - 13. Track the distribution and use of Narcan by partnering entities County-wide including tracking reversals.
 - 14. Work in collaboration with the Santa Fe Prevention Alliance and SOS to develop a strategic plan for the County to decrease mortality and morbidity related to opiate use. Include in the strategic plan Narcan distribution efforts as well as the development of a community program that increases the number of physicians in the County who prescribe buprenorphine (MAT) in primary care settings to be implemented beginning in 2017.
 - 15. Seek long term sustainable sources of funding for various entities in the County to continue to procure and disseminate Narcan and to fund the SOS Coordinator position.
- 2. Paragraph 1.C. (Scope of Duties of the parties), is amended by inserting the following as subpart "(a)":

- (a) By Amendment No. 1 to this Agreement, the County will provide to SFPS an additional amount of funding in the amount of \$85,000.00 for the services of the SOS Coordinator described herein. The total amount of funding for the term of this Agreement shall not exceed \$100,000.00, inclusive of any applicable NM grt.
- 3. Paragraph 3 (Term) is amended by inserting the following as subpart A:

A. By Amendment No. 1 to this Agreement, the term of this Agreement is extended from November 30, 2016 to June 30, 2017.

4. All other provisions of MOA not specifically amended or modified by this Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.
