The goal of SFCFD is to prepare young men and women for their future careers. We instill discipline, confidence and respect for themselves and others. Through team work and training on a daily basis. Learning to work with others in difficult situations they may encounter while on a Fire or project site. SFCFD will hire 10 individuals to fill a 10 person hand crew available for forest thinning projects in Santa Fe County. This crew will also be available for deployment to wildland fires and support search and rescue operations in and out of the county. Each member of the crew will receive basic wildland firefighter and power saw operation training and will be qualified as a wildland firefighter. After initial training the crew will consist of 10 members to include 2 leads. Two members from SFCFD firefighters will supervise the crew in all aspects of daily operations. The Wildland Coordinator for SFCFD will administrate the project. Transportation will be provided by SFCFD. Project work will consist of hazard fuel reduction projects located across Santa Fe County aimed at reducing risk of wildland fire and improving forest health. Each crew member will receive basic GPS training to map project areas to be used in the monitoring plan to track changes over time. These projects are tied directly to Santa Fe County Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) which was adopted in 2008. The crew's tasks will address the concerns and implement some of the recommendations out lined in the CWPP. The objectives include: 1) Thin small diameter trees that exacerbate fire risk; 2) create fire breaks between private homeowners and public lands; 3) chip and mulch biomass on treatment sites for use as erosion control; 4) train crew members on wildland fire science; and 5) monitor changes over time in each treatment.

The work would be to start clearing for parking and thinning of the 140 acres for hazards fuels and trail construction. This trail head would tie in to a future trail on BLM land that is adjacent to the county property. 2. State Trust Land that SFCFD has been working on for a number of years to reduce Hazard fuels. This site is located at the end of Verbena road, off State Hwy 344, San Pedro.

Treating high risk areas in the WUI areas of Santa Fe County will benefit the entire county in helping to prevent a catastrophic incident, as well as improving forest health. Trails throughout these areas not only allows the community to see and understand the benefit of treatments but also provides a model for private landowners to follow on their own lands. We often have local people arrive on treatment sites to inquire about what we are doing, which allows us to open a dialog with community members and educate them about wildfire mitigation. The fuel wood from these thinning projects directly benefits community members in need. Wildland Fire, First Aide / CPR and Search and Rescue training allows for more resources to be available to respond to community members in need as well as in the state. The training and experience they receive will benefit the community now and in to the future.

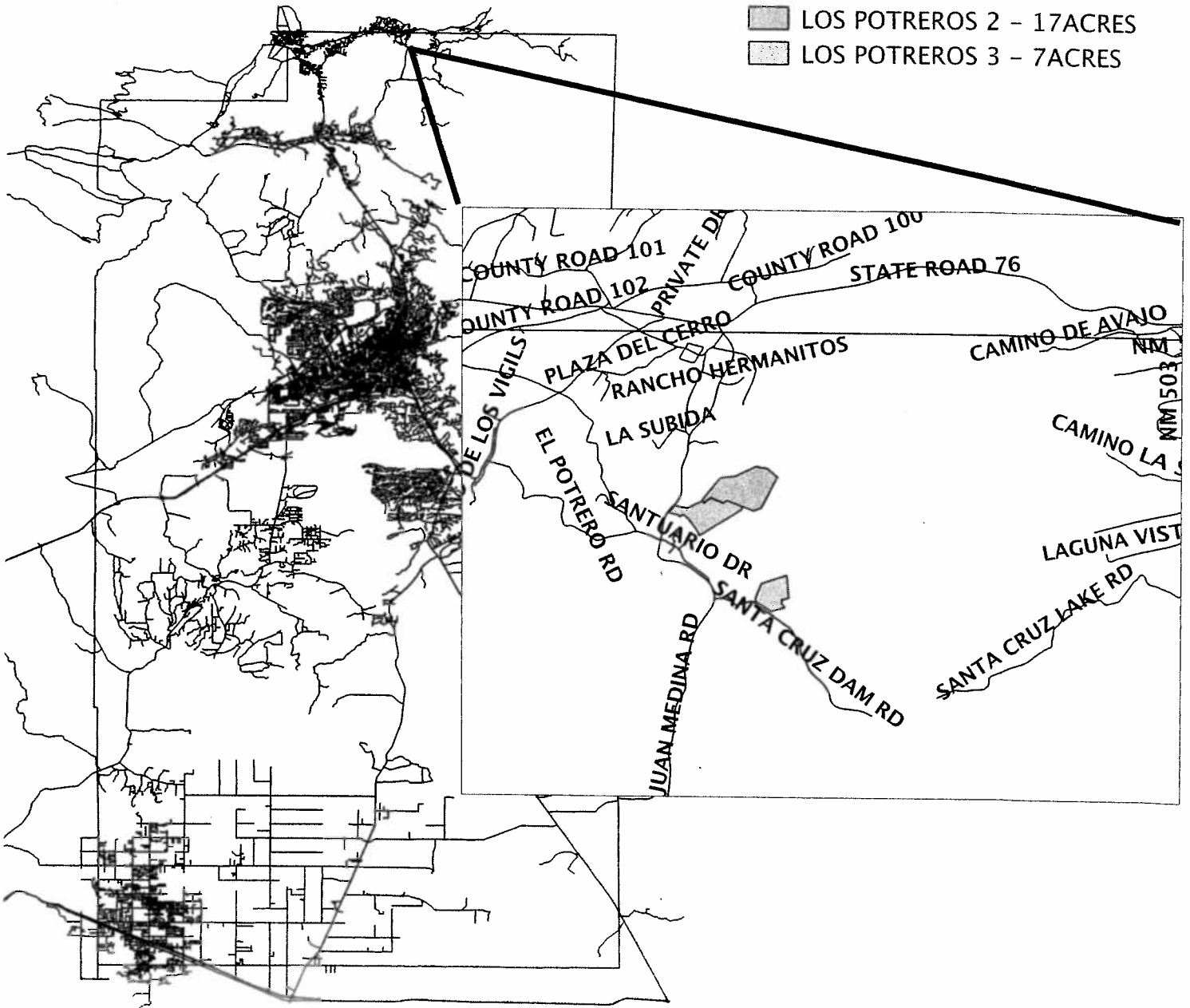
