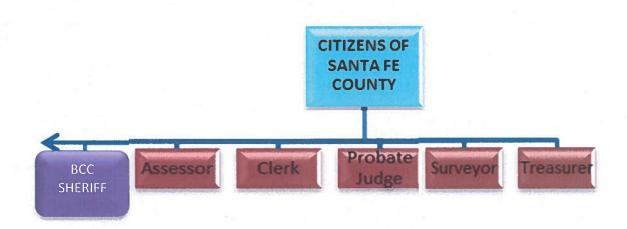

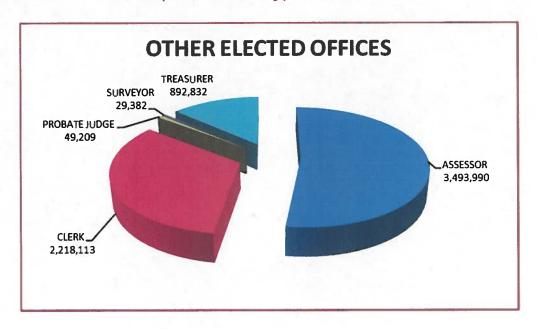

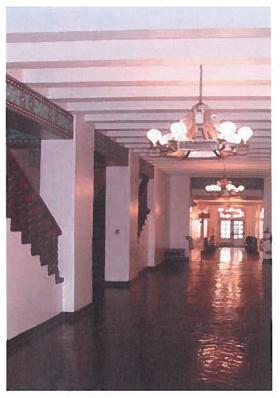
The goal of the Assessor's Office is to distribute the property tax burden, as approved by taxing authorities, correctly and equitably to all taxable property based on its value. The Assessor's Office is responsible for the valuation of property throughout the County for purposes of property taxation. The Assessor's Office accepts reports from property owners, lists and identifies property locations and collects, analyzes and interprets market and cost trends. The Assessor's Office values property in conformance with professional standards of the International Association of Assessing Officers and the laws of the State of New Mexico, and reports on property values to the property owners through the Notice of Value which is distributed annually in April.

Surveyor

The Surveyor provides expertise to the public as well as county leadership and staff relating to land surveying issues, questions, or clarifications they may encounter. The Surveyor also assists the general public with locating recorded and un-recorded property surveys, performs historical research, answers general survey questions, and interprets and understands legal descriptions. Santa Fe County is the only county in New Mexico that still retains an elected office of County Surveyor.

In the 2011 Legislative Session New Mexico's State Legislature voted to abolish the elected office of County Surveyor. Santa Fe County has the only elected surveyor, thus was the only county impacted by this law. The County Surveyor's term expires at the end of 2012.



Treasurer

The Treasurer is the property tax collector and investment officer for Santa Fe County. The Treasurer's Office distributes approximately 60,000 tax bills annually. In addition, the Treasurer's Office distributes 24,000 informational tax bills annually to notify taxpayers who escrow their property taxes. The Treasurer's Office also serves as the "County's Banker" and is responsible for collecting and depositing monies from property tax collections and from all operations of County departments. As the investment officer for the County the Treasurer invests the County's cash reserves as permitted by the County's Investment Policy.

Taxes collected by the Treasurer are distributed to the statutory beneficiaries of the County which include Santa Fe Public Schools, Pojoaque Public Schools, Espanola Public Schools, Moriarty Public Schools, Santa Fe Community College, Edgewood Soil and Water District, and the Eldorado Water and Sanitation District. Approximately 40% of all taxes collected go to the above mentioned beneficiaries and the County receives about 40% of the taxes collected. The Treasurer also collects and distributes taxes for the County's Debt Service, the State's Debt Service, the Rancho Viejo Special District, and the Children's Trust. These beneficiaries receive the balance of the taxes collected or approximately 20%.
