



Planning Division



Building and Development Division

The Building and Development Division works with the Planning Division and the public to provide permitting and development review services for construction projects in Santa Fe County. The Division provides such other services as zoning, subdivisions, lot splits, business registrations, code enforcement, hydrology, terrain management, special-use permits, and utility allocation to County citizens. The Code Enforcement component of the Building and Development Division patrols and responds to complaints of violations of County ordinances pertaining to land use as well as illegal construction or dumping activities

Geographic Information Systems (GIS) Office

The GIS Office provides high quality maps and geographic data as well as custom analysis for environmental and other decision making uses for County departments and elected offices as well as the general public. Mapping services include custom federal, state, pueblo, city, school, commercial and private maps. The Office also works with the Office of the County Assessor to ensure accurate mapping for purposes of computer aided mass appraisal (CAMA), and maintains on-line services for non-County users to access mapping and geographic information on a "24/7" basis.

Regional Planning Authority (RPA)

To goal of the RPA is to develop a Regional City-County Planning Authority Land Use Plan for the five mile area around the City. The RPA will also develop a land use map to accompany the RPA Land Use Plan that will allow for recommendations to be made on land uses for the City and County in the five-mile area around the City.

The Regional Planning Authority has been scaled back and its continuance is to be determined during FY 2012 thus no long or short-term goals were established pending disposition of the function.

Regional Transit District (NCRTD) Pass-Through


The Regional Transit Gross Receipts Tax was enacted to provide support for the North Central Regional Transit District (NCRTD). The taxes received by the County are "passed-through" directly to the NCRTD to be used to develop, plan, promote and operate a sustainable, long term regional public transportation system for its member jurisdictions. Since 100% of funds received in this fund are passed-through to the NCRTD no accomplishments or short and long-term goals are listed.
